TRIP 1.


BARWON HEADS- Thursday 26th October Pick up 10.00am Civic Centre

Members need to be 65+ and registered with My Aged Care for transport.

Members who receive homecare packages do not qualify, it is up to their agencies to provide transport which is covered with their package, sorry for any inconvenience to our members.
